As the preeminent leadership development organization for girls, Girl Scouts values girl participation and girl voices at its highest levels. We therefore invite girls to apply for a one-year, non-voting position on the GSOSW board of directors to gain exposure to organizational governance and to provide a girl perspective as appropriate during board deliberations.

The Girl Board Member will attend six bi-monthly board meetings in person if possible, or by phone, including the GSOSW Annual Meeting in April. She will receive board materials and may attend board committee meetings, as appropriate, as a representative of girl members observing and providing input. She is responsible for her own transportation. The Girl Board Member will have a board mentor to introduce her to other members, explain proceedings, answer questions, and ensure her opportunity for input.

Requirements

- The Girl Board Member will have been a Girl Scout member for a minimum of two years and will maintain her Girl Scout membership throughout the duration of her term.
- The Girl Board Member will be at least 14 years of age by the Annual Meeting at which she is elected to the board and must remain a girl member through the end of her term (18 years of age or less, not yet graduated from high school).
- The Girl Board Member pledges to represent the highest standards of Girl Scouts during her tenure on the board, and to abide by the confidentiality and ethical standards applicable to all board members.
